#### Responsible Use of Mobile Devices at Home.

In today's digital age, mobile devices play a significant role in our daily lives, including our children's education and social interactions. While these devices offer numerous benefits, it is essential to ensure their responsible use, especially within the home environment.

Here are some guidelines to promote responsible mobile device usage at home.

- **1. Set screen time limits**: Encourage your child to take regular breaks from their devices to prevent eye strain and promote physical activity.
- **2. Establish Device-Free Zones**: Designate certain areas in the home, such as the dining room or bedrooms, as device-free zones to encourage face-to-face interactions and family bonding.
- **3. Monitor content:** Regularly review the apps, games, websites and messaging platforms your child accesses to ensure they are age-appropriate and safe.
- **4. Use Parental Controls:** Utilise parental control features available on mobile devices and internet browsers to restrict access to inappropriate content and monitor your child's online activity.
- **5. Educate about Cybersecurity:** Teach your child about the importance of cybersecurity, including the risks of clicking on suspicious links, sharing passwords and downloading unknown files.

By implementing these guidelines, we can ensure that our children derive the maximum benefits from mobile devices while minimizing potential risks. Together, let's foster a safe and balanced digital environment for our families.

#### **MOE Advisory against Vaping**

E-vaporisers are illegal in Singapore. Under the Tobacco (Control of Advertisements and Sale) Act, the possession, use or purchase of e-vaporisers carries a maximum fine of \$2,000. It is also an offence to import, distribute, sell or offer for sale e-vaporisers and their components. Any person convicted of such offences is liable to a fine of up to \$10,000, or imprisonment of up to six months or both for the first offence, and a fine of up to \$20,000, or imprisonment of up to 12 months or both for the second or subsequent offence. All prohibited tobacco items will be seized and confiscated.

MOE takes a firm stand against vaping. Vaping is categorised as a serious offence. When students are caught using or in possession of e-vaporisers, the prohibited product will be confiscated, and their parents will be informed. The schools will report the offender to HSA and manage vaping-related offences through existing disciplinary frameworks. These include taking school-based disciplinary actions,

such as suspension or caning (for boys). Students caught vaping will also be placed on cessation support programmes where counsellors will guide them through their cessation journey to effect long-term behavioural change.

Parents have an important part to play in their children's education. There are resources and relevant information that parents can access on Parent Hub. Parents are encouraged to have a serious conversation with their children about vaping to prevent it from becoming a life-long habit.
