

POLY FOUNDATION PROGRAMME (PFP)

WHAT IS IT?

- One-year programme
- Prepares N(A) students for entry into the relevant Polytechnic Diploma courses.
- 1,500 places set aside each year
- Offered by all five Polytechnics.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE FOR IT?

- **ELMAB3** (English, Mathematics and Best 3 Subjects) raw aggregate score of **12** points or better, excluding CCA bonus points) at the GCE N Level examination
- <u>Subject Requirements</u> (Minimum Grade for Specific Subjects)

Application: Immediately after O level results in January 2025

Posting results: End of January

Please note that <u>eligibility to apply for PFP does not guarantee placement</u> in the programme.

Students placed on the PFP may or may not be posted to the course of his / her choice, subject to competition based on merit and the availability of places.

WHAT IS IT?

(ITE)Higher Nitec (2 yrs)



Polytechnic (2/3 yrs)

About 1,200 DPP places are offered across all three ITE Colleges. Eligibility does not guarantee placement in a DPP course.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE FOR IT?

- Obtain an ELMAB3 aggregate of **19 points or better** (excluding CCA bonus points); **and**
- Meet the course-specific entry requirements.

Qualifying *Higher Nitec* GPA for Progression to Polytechnics under DPP

In order to be assured of a place in the polytechnics, students must meet the qualifying 2-year *Higher Nitec* GPA as shown in the table below.

WHAT IS IT? An aptitude-based admissions exercise.

- 3 years Higher Nitec to 3 years Poly
- 2 years Nitec to 2 years Higher Nitec to 3 years Poly Students will apply and receive **conditional offers for admission** to the ITE based on their

All shortlisted students will be interviewed (They must prepare for it)

aptitudes and interests, prior to receiving their final grades.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE FOR IT?

If you have strong aptitude and passion in a field related to a *Nitec* or *Higher Nitec* course, the ITE EAE is for you.

Meet the course-specific <u>Minimum Entry Requirements (MER)</u> for the ITE course you have been offered under ITE EAE* for the conditional offers to be confirmed






