Prisons (Amendment Bill 2021)

The Prisons (Amendment) Bill 2021 was passed in Parliament on 11 Jan 2022. With the introduction of the Employment Preparation Scheme (EmPS), inmates will be allowed to undergo skills training and education in the community. This will complement the work programmes and skills training provided by SPS and YRSG.

Professional Certificate in Correctional Management 2022

Singapore Prison Service (SPS)

Community Corrections Command (COMC) collaborated with NUS to develop a Professional Certificate in Correctional Management. The Professional Certificate, which comprises four customised modules, aims to enhance competencies in community corrections. It is open to individuals working or interested in community corrections. The modules are listed below:

Professional Certificate in Correctional Management	Run Dates
Module 1: Process and Punishment	Pending date for 2 nd run in 2022
Module 2: Multicultural Sensitivity in Corrections	15-16 Feb 2022
Module 3: Enhancing Ethical Reasoning in Corrections	24-25 May 2022
Module 4: Integrating Theory (Case Formulation) and Use of Self (Reflective Practice) in Community Correction	16-17 Aug 2022
