Split bamboo striker – Hawkers used to ply the streets selling homemade noodles or 'tok tok mee' (also known as 'kok kok mee'). They would attract customers by hitting a bamboo striker, such as the one seen here, against a piece of split bamboo. The rhythmic 'tok tok' sound became the hawkers' distinctive food call, alerting customers in the vicinity.

Porcelain bowl for 'tok tok mee' – The hawkers went around with three-wheeled wooden pushcarts, complete with ingredients, charcoal stove, pots, and porcelain bowls such as this one show here, as well as utensils. [2006-01387]



Porcelain 'laksa' bowls – This is a porcelain bowl with a white ground and a gloss finish, featuring southern Chinese



motifs. Earlier forms of 'laksa' (a curry based noodle dish) were usually served by street hawkers in small, locally handmade bowls such as this one.

Bamboo brush with bristles used for woks – This brush, made of split bamboo bristles, was often used to remove the stubborn stains and charred grit that could remain in the cast-iron wok after cooking 'char kway teow'.




