EU P2P Export Control Programme







55 partner countries - since 2004

- Promotion of export control policies and measures in line with EU policies and international obligations by strengthening controls of dual-use trade and arms trade worldwide.
- Cooperation with EU's strategic partners for joint enhancement of effectiveness of trade control systems by sharing experiences and best practices
- Integration with EU CBRN Centres of Excellence Initiative's framework as a platform for engagements and project delivery

- EU P2P Dialogue on Export Control Governance (seminar with regimes WA, MTCR, AG, NSG): every two years.














EU export controls in the context of EU strategic autonomy



- Trade Policy Communication Open Strategic Autonomy (18 February 2021)
- EU Strategic Autonomy as a policy objective of the European Union under the von der Leyen Commission.
- New "trade and security" toolbox: investment screening & export controls, anti-coercion instrument...















EU export controls and sanctions in 2022: at a crossroads



Three major developments shape the development of EU export controls & sanctions policy in 2022:

- The **EU-US Trade and Technology Council** (TTC) See Pittsburgh Joint Statement, 29 Sept. 2021 (<u>EU-US Trade and Technology Council Inaugural Joint Statement (europa.eu)</u>
- Russia sanctions export restrictions on dual-use goods and technology and "Advanced Technologies" (Sanctions adopted following Russia's military aggression against Ukraine | European Commission (europa.eu)
- A new Export Control Regulation (EU) 2021/821 of 20 May 2021, in force on 9 Sept.
 2021 (Commission's actions to implement new EU Export Control Regulation Memo Trade European Commission (europa.eu)













The EU-US Trade and Technology Council



- Pittsburgh Summit <u>EU-US Trade and Technology Council Inaugural Joint</u> <u>Statement (europa.eu)</u>, 29 Sept. 2021
 - > Technical consultations on legislative and regulatory developments;
 - > Development of convergent control approaches on sensitive dual-use technologies and destinations and entities of concern,
 - > Technology transfers and dual-use research of concern and exchange of best practices to support the effective application of controls while facilitating research collaboration between EU and US research organizations;
 - > Technical consultations on compliance and enforcement approaches
 - Capacity building assistance to third countries
 - > Technical consultations regarding multilateral and international cooperation
- 1st meeting of the Export Control Working Group on 26 January 2022
- 2nd Ministerial Meeting in Paris, 15-16 May 2022
- 2nd meeting of the Export Control Working Group on 7-8 June 2022













The Russia sanctions – export restrictions on dual-use and «advanced technologies»



- Prohibition on export of dual-use items and new list of « advanced technologies »..., for all end-uses and end-users in Russia with limited exemptions and derogations
- Continuous development of the measures: Several sanctions « packages » amending <u>Regulation (EU) No 833/2014 concerning restrictive measures</u> in view of <u>Russia's actions destabilising the situation in Ukraine</u>
- COM-Member States cooperation to support effective implementation and enforcement: industry outreach and guidance, information-exchange
- Unprecedented cooperation with partner countries (US, UK, Japan...)













Export Control Regulation – key innovations



- A new **Export Control Regulation** (EU) 2021/821
- The new Regulation represents a *comprehensive "system upgrade*": virtually all provisions of the Regulation are amended in order to enhance the efficiency and/or the effectiveness of controls. This includes *updated* definitions and control parameters, harmonisation, simplification and digitalisation of licensing, enhanced information-sharing, and cooperation with third-countries. The "system upgrade" also introduces *new* rules on transparency, enforcement, industry outreach and an EU training programme.
- The new Regulation introduces a basis for **EU autonomous controls** allowing the EU to make its own decisions regarding "human security controls" e.g. on cyber-surveillance technologies, and controls on emerging technologies.















Key innovations



Updated definitions:

- Technical assistance: Articles 2 & 8: New definition of 'provider of technical assistance' (including assistance within the EU) and cope of controls
- Exporter: New definition covering the personal baggage of natural persons

EU autonomous controls:

- Article 5: controls on non-listed cyber-surveillance items (authorisation and notification requirements)
- Articles 9-10: Allow Member State controls on non-listed items on grounds of public security, preventing terrorism and human rights considerations

Facilitating legitimate trade:

- Available authorisations: Individual Export Authorisations, Union General Export Authorisations, National General Export Authorisations, Global Export Authorisation, Large Project Authorisation New
- New EUGEAS: Union GEA No EU007: Intra-group export of software and technology, Union GEA No EU008: Encryption













Facilitating compliance



Commission Recommendation (EU) 2021/1700 of 15 September 2021 on internal compliance programmes for controls of research involving dual-use items

Commission Recommendation (EU) 2019/1318 of 30 July 2019 on internal compliance programmes for dual-use trade controls

Recital 3:

This Regulation also aims to **strengthen the guidance to be given to exporters**, in particular to small and medium-sized enterprises (SMEs), regarding responsible practices, yet without impairing the global competitiveness of exporters of dual-use items or other associated industry or academia which are resident or established in a Member State.













Export Control Regulation – the work programme



- Setting up an EU mechanism for *human rights controls on cyber-surveillance exports*, including the publication in the Official Journal (C series) of an "EU watch list" and adoption of due diligence guidelines (Surveillance Technology Expert Group STEG)
- Creating a mechanism allowing the EU to "react rapidly to new risks associated with *emerging technologies*" (Emerging Technology Expert Group ETEG)
- Developing a "partnership with the private sector", incl. electronic licensing (<u>See e-Licensing videos</u>), Technical Expert Groups, public consultations on e.g. due diligence guidelines and transparency guidelines, industry outreach
- Cooperation with third countries "global convergence of controls" (Art. 29)
