Total Defence Day (TDD)

Theme: Together We Keep Singapore Strong

Total Defence Day (TDD) 2024 will mark 40 Years of Total Defence (TD40). The focus for TDD 2024 will be on Singaporean's readiness and resilience in the face of crises and disruptions. Events in recent years have made it more apparent how Singapore can be susceptible to various disruptions of resources key to our basic needs.

As part of the commemoration of TD40 this year, the students will experience an **energy disruption simulation** in school on **Friday, 16 February 2024 during** which, electricity will be turned off school-wide for an hour from 7.45 am to 8.45 am.

Besides the TD40 Exercise, the following activities will be carried out between Monday, 5 February and Friday, 23 February that relate to the 6 pillars of Total Defence.

- Integration of TD40 into the CCE (FTGP) and SS lessons
- Assembly Programmes Skit on Food Sustainability and TDD in GSPS
- First Aid Demonstration by the P6 Scouts trained in the Lionhearters' Programme

2024 MOE Kindergarten Registration Exercise

Online Registration for MK Sibling Priority Admission (Priority Order 2)

Singapore Citizen (SC) and Permanent Resident (PR) children born between 2 January 2020 and 1 January 2021 (both dates inclusive), who have elder siblings currently studying in **K1 - P6** in the MK or the primary school that the MK is located within, are eligible for sibling priority (Priority Order 2) admission to 2025 K1.

If you intend to register your child under sibling priority admission, you will need to submit your application online during the 2024 MK registration period from **9am on Friday**, **16 February 2024 to 4pm on Tuesday**, **20 February 2024**.

You will be notified of the Open Admissions (OA) registration outcome by **Monday, 15 April 2024 via e-mail**. If you do not receive the outcome e-mail, you should check the junk e-mail folder. Otherwise, you can contact the MOE Kindergarten (MK) directly.

If your child is currently enrolled in an Early Years Centre (EYC) partnering an MK, you will also receive a notification letter for EYC children by 31 January 2024. You will be directed to the same registration webpage via the QR code / URL link above to start the registration process.

Onsite Uniform and PE Attire Sale (Primary Students)

This is to inform you that there is an onsite sale of school uniforms and PE attire in school on **15 March, Friday from 10.00am to 2.30pm.** Parents/Guardians are encouraged to call the uniform vendor, Chop Kong Chong, to check on the availability of sizes prior to coming down to school.

You can also place an order online and collect your order onsite on 15 March. Online ordering will be available from 15 February to 10 March for onsite collection and a delivery fee will be collected but will be refunded when the order is collected onsite. For non-collection of online orders, the vendor will contact you for delivery to your home address.

Always cross-check information with legitimate sources.

EARLY REPORTING MATTERS

Parents play a key role in keeping our children safe from the terror threat. We are best placed to notice changes in our children, and raise the alert if we detect any signs of radicalisation.

Early reporting allows authorities to intervene before radicalised individuals harm themselves or others. They will also receive guidance and counselling. Any information provided will be kept strictly confidential.



RADICALISATION AND EXTREMISM IN SINGAPORE

People may be radicalised in different ways to engage in extremism, or even terrorism-related activities.

RADICALISATION

 The <u>process</u> by which people come to support extremist beliefs.

EXTREMISM

 The holding of political or religious views that are far from the mainstream

THE EVOLVING TERROR THREAT IN SINGAPORE

The terrorism threat to Singapore remains high. Terrorist groups have stepped up their recruitment efforts targeting youths, using social media and online gaming platforms to spread extremist propaganda. Today, self-radicalised individuals are a key threat to Singapore's safety and security.

While ISD will continue to detect and prevent terror attacks, we cannot do this alone. It is important that parents remain alert to signs that their child may have become radicalised.

ENGAGING YOUR CHILD

" HOW DO I TALK ABOUT IT? "

Create a safe space to talk

Let your child feel at ease.
Engage them when you are both unlikely to be interrupted, or when the topic is relevant.

Understand how your child feels

- Ask for their opinions
 Use open-ended questions.
- Listen sincerely.

Provide simple, honest answers

- Share your views calmly, in an engaging manner.
- Gently correct wrong perceptions.

" WHAT SHOULD I KEEP IN MIND?"

- Be approachable. Let them know you are here to help if they are concerned or unsure about something.
- Do not be confrontational. Your child's beliefs require careful handling.
- Let them speak without interrupting. Encourage them to ask questions.
- 4. Avoid stereotyping people by race, religion, or nationality. Encourage mutual respect and tolerance.
