

FAQ

1) Which levels should the student leaders be from?

The student leaders should be from Secondary 2 or 3 / JC 1. Schools should not be sending outgoing students who will be stepping down shortly.

2) Which appointments should the student leaders be holding?

It is recommended to send your Chairperson, Vice-Chairperson, Tech for Good Champion, Emerging Tech Specialist and 2 other exco members. Please click [here](#) for details about these 2 new roles.

3) What are the workshops that the student leaders can attend?

Student leaders can attend any of the following four workshops.

(*Please note that the workshop registration is on first-come-first-served basis and the finalised allocation will be emailed out subsequently.)

- **AI storyboarding with Krock.io (24 pax – Function Room 1)**
 - Krock.io is an efficient method to create visually appealing storyboards required for video content using artificial intelligence (AI).
 - Students will learn how to use AI to generate the script and visuals required for a video.
- **App design with Marvel (36 pax – Function Room 2)**
 - Marvel is an app which provides a quick and easy way to design interactive app prototypes.
 - Students will learn how to create a functional prototype in 15 minutes and practice rapid prototyping of ideas.
- **Human library with Tech for Good founders (30 pax – Function Room 3)**
 - Students will have small group conversations with Tech for Good founders whose companies and organisations leverage tech to make social impact.
 - Through interacting with them, students will hear about their real-life experiences and find out how they too can get involved in using tech to give back to the community.
- **Social Media for Good (360 pax - Theatre)**
 - Students will learn from a content creator who will share about her personal journey and process in posting positive and uplifting content on social media.
 - Through this workshop, students will learn how they too, can use social media as a force for good.

4) Can my Club send more than 6 students? (i.e register more than once with different names)

We aim to accommodate as many schools and Infocomm Media Clubs as possible so teachers should only register a maximum of 6 student leaders per Club. Do note that registration is on a first-come-first-served basis.

You may however write in to indicate interest in sending more student leaders. We will contact you closer to the date should there be space for additional students from the same Club.

5) Do teachers need to be present at the conference?

Teachers do not need to be present as IMDA staff will be at the conference to ensure student safety. However, teachers who are required by their school to chaperone the students may still come and wait at a designated area in the Drama Centre. Do note that only student-centric programmes have been prepared for this conference.

6) Is the conference free of charge?

Yes, the conference is complimentary in nature and no payment is required.

7) Will transportation be provided?

Transportation will not be provided. The Drama Centre is a centrally located venue which is a 5 minutes' walk away from Bugis MRT.

8) Will meals be provided?

A halal certified tea break will be provided and there is an option in the registration form to indicate whether your student requires a vegetarian meal.

9) Will there be a RAMS form provided?

A RAMS form will not be provided but any additional details will be sent by early October, including the programme for the day as well as the evacuation plan in the event of fire. There will not be any physically strenuous activities.

10) Will a certificate of participation be provided?

An e-certificate template will be emailed out to teachers who can then fill in the student leaders' names and print out the certificates.

11) Will there be an online livestream of the workshop?

The workshop will only be conducted face-to-face for participants at the venue.
