FAQ

1) Must my student leaders attend both Part I and Part II of the training?

Student leaders are strongly encouraged to attend both Part I and Part II of training to maximise their learning. However, should your school be unable to do so, you may still register your student leaders for each part independently.

3) May I send two different sets of students to attend Part I and Part II?

We would like to request that schools send a consistent group of students to attend both parts of the training. Should there be any student leaders who are unable to attend at the last minute, substitutes may attend instead.

3) Do teachers need to be present at the workshops?

Teachers are welcome to sit in for the online workshops should they choose to do so. IMDA staff will be present to ensure student safety.

4) Are the workshops free of charge?

Yes, these workshops are complimentary in nature and no payment is required.

5) What if my student leaders for the year have not been officially elected yet?

We understand that some Clubs would run elections prior to officially appointing the next Exco after the incumbent Secondary 4 leaders have stepped down later in Semester 1.

Should that be the case, you may nominate your prospective leaders to attend the training.
