| 8. | Time to let go Allow your child to make mistakes and learn from them | Let them try to do things on their ownTeach them how to ask for help |
| 9. | Show interest in your child Find out about what they're doing and how they're feeling | Ask them how they feel about their dayChat about what they do with friends |
| 10. | Every child is unique Work with teachers to find out your child's strengths and interests | Talk with them about what they're good atAsk them what they like and dislike |
