

# STEP 1

Introducing VMS-SIR



The Volunteer Management System — Selection and Implementation Roadmap (VMS-SIR) is a guide for SSAs in their search, selection and implementation of a Volunteer Management System (VMS), sharing common trends, gaps and considerations, with the inclusion of resources that can be tapped on towards the adoption of a VMS.

The VMS-SIR aims to increase adoption, usage and satisfaction of a VMS leading to optimising SSA's volunteer management capability, spending less time on data management. It provides a clearer guide and process in identifying a suitable VMS and especially for SSAs who are unclear on how to scope their needs, requirements and have optimal use of the system.

Within the VMS-SIR (on pg.27), there is a Self-Assessment Template (SAT) which SSAs can use to help address the difficulties in identifying and optimising the use of a suitable VMS relevant to the SSA's current position. The SAT would help agencies better understand and communicate their needs, requirements, processes and readiness for a VMS to various stakeholders.

Where can I source for help for the implementation of a Volunteer Management System?

The Volunteer Management System – Selection and Implementation Roadmap includes various resources and support that you may use, such as potential funding sources.

Is there a recommended Volunteer Management System suitable for SSAs or a list of VMS suppliers / vendors for reference?

There isn't a recommended VMS for the sector. A VMS should cater to the needs of the individual SSAs, so it would be more effective for the SSA to speak with a vendor to address its requirement.

Will the VMS-SIR allow SSAs to evaluate the effectiveness of existing Volunteer Management System?

Before approaching a potential VMS supplier to discuss on your needs, we would strongly recommend that you complete the Self-Assessment Template to better understand your organisation's readiness and requirements.

The VMS-SIR does not provide a direct evaluation of effectiveness of your existing VMS as such measurements are most

What the VMS-SIR can offer is an indication of how your agency has been managing with a Volunteer Management System. If the self-assessment template shows a lower score despite having an existing VMS, it would be an indication to review your VMS, and to implement one that better suits your needs.

Are there different funding schemes for different areas of Volunteer Management System adoption (e.g. purchase, maintenance, customisation)?

There are no different funding schemes under VCF-Innovation & Productivity Grant (IPG) for different expenditure items. All the expenditure items related to the project will be considered as one funding if they come in as one application. However, do note that for subscription and maintenance fees for the system, VCF-IPG will only cover up to the first year.

Are SSAs restricted to iShine Cloud as the primary vendor for Volunteer Management System should they require funding from NCSS? Are SSAs eligible for NCSS funding should they adopt a Volunteer Management System of their choice?

SSAs may also consider the Tech-and-Go Funding Support which is applicable for pre-scoped solutions. iShine Cloud is a joint-venture between NCSS and Singapore Pools. As such, there are NCSS' administrators helping

SSAs/charities to onboard and adopt solutions in the areas of HR, Accounting, Donor and Volunteer Management. Hence, as part of VCF grant administration procedure, all solutions related to these 4 areas will have to be reviewed and assessed by

iShine Cloud.

Only in the event that iShine Cloud's solutions are unable to support the project and/or unsuitable to meet the needs and requirements of the SSAs/charities, the VCF Secretariat will then consider funding the project under VCF-IPG, and SSAs/charities are then allowed to go with the vendor of their choice.

Alternatively, SSAs may consider the NCSS Tech-and-Go Funding Support which supports the adoption of technology under the list of pre-scoped solutions.
