




What's In Your School Bag?


School Uniform

School Uniform	Students are to wear the prescribed school uniform and modification to the		
	uniform is not allowed.		
School Top	 Clean School Polo T-shirt is to be always tucked in. 		
	Girls are not to wear bright-coloured undergarments under their school uniform.		
Nametag	 Name tag must be ironed on/sewn above the school badge. 		
School Bottom	Boys are to wear bermudas that should be no longer than 1-inch above the		
	knees.		
	 Girls are to wear skorts no longer than 1-inch above the knees. 		
Socks	Only plain white socks are allowed, and they should be worn at least 2 inches above the ankles.		
Shoes	Only plain black canvas/sports shoes are allowed. There should be no fanciful/ reflective/coloured stripes on any part of the shoes.		
PE Attire	Students can put on their school PE shorts <u>only</u> on days with PE/PAL lessons. At other times, students are expected to wear their formal school attire (Skorts/Bermudas).		



Hair

- Boys must keep their hair short and tidy. They should not have hair touching the collar, ears, or eyebrows. Hair at the side and back must be sloped.
- Girls with long fringe are to keep them off their faces with dark blue/black pins or hair bands.
- Hair reaching below the collar must be tied up neatly with plain blue/black rubber bands or clips.







Nametags

Name tag must be ironed on/sewn above the school badge.









Earrings

- Girls are allowed to wear one pair of matching plain ear-studs (less than 5mm in diameter) on the ear lobes.
- For safety reasons, <u>NO</u> dangling or multiple earrings are allowed.

Punctuality

- Students are to be in school by 7.20am.
- Lessons start at 7.30a.m. sharp after flag raising.

Attendance

- Students must attend school at all times during school days.
- Students must be early and punctual for school.
- Students who are **not in class by 7.30a.m. will be considered late**.
- For persistent latecomers and students who do not attend school regularly, students will be referred to the Year Head, HOD Discipline and Student Management for further actions and parents will be engaged by the school.



Absence from School

- Medical Certificate or a letter from parent/guardian is needed to explain child's absence. (Limit of 5 letters per semester)
- For matters pertaining to Covid-19, please reach out to the form teachers or school for clarifications.
- Call the General Office and leave a message for your child/ward Form Teacher.
- Remind your child/ward to pass the MC or letter to their Form Teacher when he/she is back in school.

Helping them be ready to learn





Talking about how to make friends







Reading

Reading is a habit that we can build in children.
P1 teachers will build on basic word recognition.
You can support by:

Always prepare your child with a book to school every day.

Cultivating a love for reading

Take your child to the library and allow them to choose their own books. Read together with them.

Taking small steps

Provide time to see sight words repeatedly. Sight words are the words that appear most frequently in our reading and writing.



Writing

As hand muscles take time to develop and mature, your child does not need to perfect their penmanship upon entering P1.

You can support them by:



Strengthen their muscles through activities like moulding dough, peeling an orange and watering plants with a spray bottle.

Taking small steps

Practise writing and copying on a blank piece of paper first, then on a lined paper when they are ready.



Aa

Some letters like 's' and 'g' are harder to write as they require good finger control to shape. Give them time and praise them as they progress.





Note Taking


In school, children may need to copy homework from the board. This requires

hand-eye coordination, and some may need more time.

Practising with them

Give them opportunities to copy words/short phrases from a piece of paper placed next to them.

You can support them by:





Working on meaningful tasks

Help them enjoy writing/copying with meaningful tasks such as writing a birthday card or copying your grocery list.



Paying attention

Children do better when they stay focused during group learning and complete tasks.

You can support them by:

Doing fun activities which require focus together

Do activities that require focus to complete together (e.g puzzles). Sing songs with movements and repetitions, which can help reinforce memory.





Developing an awareness of time

Help them gauge time by saying, "Let's play for another 10 more minutes and we will go home".

In this book, you'll find 10 tips for parents—to help you and your child adjust smoothly to primary—school life. Each tip includes activities which you can do together.

 Help them learn the importance of staying focussed and following instructions e.g., through a simple baking activity.

Ask for help when needed

- Encourage your child to ask for help if they need it.
- Teach them when they should ask for help, who to ask help from and how to ask for help e.g., from teachers or fellow classmates.

Learn to be independent

- A big change from pre-school to primary school includes new things your child will have to do independently.
- Provide opportunities for your child to be independent in tasks such as changing their clothes and cleaning up after themselves after an activity.
- Developing these practical skills early can help inculcate an attitude of independence and give them more confidence in their new environment.

Interact with others

- Show your child how to say hello to a new friend at school.
- Model good behaviour such as taking turns and saying "please" and "thank you".
- Help them develop self-control and manage their emotions when they lose in a game e.g., musical chairs.

Go to the toilet on their own



- Explain to your child why it is important to learn how to go to the <u>toilet</u> on their own and to clean up properly afterwards.
- Let them know that it is okay to ask for help or ask for a buddy to go with them at the start.

Have good personal hygiene

- Remind them to keep their masks on in school unless they are eating and to observe safe distancing. Help them understand the importance of doing so.
- Remind them to keep their hands clean and wash them regularly e.g., before and after meals.

Take care of personal belongings

- Start supporting them in packing their bags for school and remind them to pack only what is needed.
- Guide your child to write their name on their belongings.
- Teach them how to manage their money* so that they can buy food during recess.
- * If your child would like to buy something from the bookshop, remind them to ask for permission from you the day before.



Tip: Practise the new routine and route to school. Helping them get used to it earlier may help them feel more prepared.





Starter Tips for School

Help your child to understand and verbalise:

- Names and contact numbers of parents and/or caregivers (handbook)

- School routines such as morning assembly, recess and dismissal
- Going-home arrangement





School Routines & Safety





Morning Assembly

- Assemble in the classrooms or school hall by 7.20am.
- Teachers on duty will guide the students to the classrooms or hall.
- Form Teachers will mark students' attendance.
- Flag-Raising will start promptly at 7.30 a.m.
 - Singing of the National Anthem
 - Pledge Taking
- Morning Greeting



Recess

Form teachers and staff on duty will:

- bring the students down to the canteen at 9.00 a.m.
- assist students to buy food, drinks, manage their food, drinks and be readily available to assist the students.
- accompany our Primary 1 students throughout the recess.



After Recess

Form teachers or staff on duty will:

- ensure students have finished eating, clean their eating space and wash their hands.
- accompany the students back to their classroom at 9.30 a.m. to continue with their lessons/activities.





Snack Break


- Pack healthy and bite-sized snacks.
- Snack time will be at 12pm daily in the classroom for 10 minutes.
- Share with students about 'snack time' and try it at home.



Arrival of School

- Students must reach school by 7.20 a.m.
- There are three entry points into the school: -
 - ➤ Gate B (Side Gate)
 - ➤Gate E (Back Gate nearest to Nibong LRT)
 - > Vehicular Drop-off at the Foyer outside General Office







After Day 1,

- Parents will drop their child off at Entrance of Gate B.
- Parents will not be allowed to enter beyond Gate B.
- Students will walk along the walkway and into the school.
- Teachers will be stationed along the pathway to assist the students.

After Day 1,

- Parents will drop their child off at Entrance of Gate E (LRT).
- Parents will not be allowed to enter beyond Gate E (LRT).
- Students will walk along the walkway and into the school.
- Teachers will be stationed along the walkway to assist the students.
- Parents are advised not to congregate around the gate and block entry.





Students' Arrival (Vehicle Drop-off)



- Please ensure that the students get off on the left side of the vehicle safely.
- For parents driving to school please drive safely and adhere to the <u>speed limit of 10km/h.</u>
- Refrain from getting out of your car so that it will not cause a congestion at the drop-off point.



Dismissal

- Primary 1 Dismissal is at 1.20 p.m.
- There are 5 dismissal arrangements:
 - >Gate B
 - **≻Gate E**
 - >Vehicular Drop-off at Foyer outside General Office
 - >School Bus
 - >Student Care Centre
- There will be designated entrance and waiting areas, and floor markings for adults waiting for their children during dismissal.



Pick up by Parents at Gate B

- Last period teacher will bring the Primary 1 students down to Level 1 and release them to walk to the Parents Waiting Area leading to Gate B.
- Teachers will be stationed at the Parents Waiting Area to ensure students are handed over to the parents/care-givers.





School Safety – Entrance to the Parents Waiting Area at Gate B

• Parents' entrance and waiting area at **Gate B** – Walkway along Gate B leading to the zebra crossing.









Pick up by Parents at Gate E (enter to Cove)

- Parents will stand on the markers pasted on the floor of the COVE which is demarcated by levels.
- Last period teacher will bring the Primary students down to the Cove and hand them over to their parents/caregivers.



School Safety – Entrance to the Parents Waiting Area at Gate E (enter to Cove)

 Parents' Entrance Gate E (LRT) – Walkway along Gate E leading to the gate to the Cove.





Vehicular Pick-Up Foyer

• Last period teacher will bring the Primary 1 students down to Level 1 and release them to walk along the school corridors towards the General Office.

• Teachers will be stationed outside the General Office to ensure that the students wait safely for their parents' to pick them up.







- Students will wait at the Foyer (outside General Office) for their parents to pick them up.
- Vehicles may enter the school premises only from 1.45 p.m. onwards).



School Bus Dismissal

- Form Teachers will accompany students to the hall and ensure proper hand over to the school bus drivers.
- Bus drivers will be stationed at the hall to assemble the students with safe management measures in place before bringing them down to board the school bus.
- Staff I/C will ensure that the students are belted up before the school bus can leave the school.





School-Based Student Care Centre

• Primary 1 students who are in Student Care, will wait in the classroom after dismissal.

• Student Care Teachers will take over the students immediately after dismissal.





School Safety- Arrival and Dismissal

- For the safety of our students and staff, parents <u>will not be</u> <u>allowed</u> to enter the school premises (e.g. Canteen) when dropping off or picking up your child from the school every morning and during dismissal. Parents will also not be able to pass through The Cove and Canteen to get to the LRT Station and vice versa.
- Parents and guardians to remind your child/ward on the importance of road safety. For example: Make use of the traffic light when crossing the road; look out for heavy vehicles before they cross the road.

- Lanyard with nametag <u>has to be worn</u> by the students on the <u>first month</u> of school to provide identification and the details of going-home arrangement.
- Please <u>indicate</u> on the lanyard tag on the going-home arrangement (i.e., Sch Bus Number (going home) / Side Gate B / Gate E (LRT) / Student Care Centre / In front of General Office for vehicular pick-up)

As parents, you have a crucial role to play - by being a good role model on safe road use and educating your child on the importance of road safety.

This brochure contains information on how you can play a part to enhance road safety at school zones. It also includes a fun activity that will help your child learn more about road safety.

iding your Child

- Set the right example for your child when walking or cycling to school and crossing the road:
- ✓ Use footpaths and designated crossings (e.g. pedestrian crossings, pedestrian overhead bridges).

 ✓ Do not walk between parked are included.
- ✓ Do not walk between parked vehicles or buses, and be on the lookout for vehicles before turning from a path.
- ✓ Look out for cyclists or personal mobility device riders.
- ✓ Do not rush. Always stop, look out for traffic in all directions and make eye contact with drivers before stepping off a kerb.
- ✓ Be attentive and avoid using gadgets such as mobile phones.

Tips for Parents

Parents and the community have a responsibility to help ensure the safety of children.

To reduce traffic congestion at school zones, consider the following alternatives when ferrying your child to/from school:

- ✓ If your child is taking public transport or the school bus:
- Stand behind the yellow line when waiting at the bus stop.
- •Do not rush to board the bus; board the bus in an orderly manner.
- . Hold on to the handrails or poles when standing in the bus.
- •Always face forward, hold on to the handrails and do not play when using the escalator.
- Walk or cycle to school. If you cycle, you are required to install handbrakes on the bicycle and practise these safe riding habits:
- · Wear a helmet for safety.
- Stop and look out for oncoming vehicles before riding across road crossings.
- · Give way to pedestrians.
- Go slow or dismount and push your bicycle when approaching crowded areas.
- Use cycling paths when available.
- Keep left on paths and alert others before overtaking.
- ✓ Try car/taxi pooling with those staying nearby or en route to your child's school.
- If you still need to drive, please pick up or drop off your child at a proper parking space (e.g. public car parks) so that your child's and other road users' safety will not be compromised.

Traffic Safety Measures

Keeping children safe at school zones is top priority. Several traffic measures are implemented at school zones to remind motorists to slow down, drive carefully and to look out for children crossing the road.

These include:

- ✓ School zone signs
- ✓ Traffic calming measures such as road humps
- ✓ Pedestrian crossings
- ✓ Parking restriction lines
- ✓ Railings along the road divider
- ✓ "SLOW" and "SCHOOL" road markings
- Delta de la Control de la Cont
- ✓ Red-textured road surfaces







Communication with Teachers

- Have regular conversations with our teachers in both academic and non-academic areas – this will help you better guide your child's holistic development.
- Ask the teachers for the best way and time to contact them.
- Call the General Office to leave a message for the teacher to call back to make an appointment to meet the teachers

The school bookshop operating hours will be from 9.00am 3.00pm. Please note that there may be a long queue with longer waiting time expected. Payment is via cash and PayNow.





Purchase of School Uniform

Home delivery services will be processed with a delivery fee of \$\$10.00 per trip. Detailed sizing guides, care guides and exchange policies etc. are provided on their online store. The payment method for online purchase is PayNow only.
- P1 parents may also purchase the uniform through the walk-in sales on 21 November 2023, 22 November 2023 and 23 November 2023 at the school's CCA Room 3. The operating hours will be from 9.00am 3.00pm. Please note that there may be a long queue with longer waiting time expected. Payment is via cash and PayNow.
