



- Work with your child's teachers to understand their strengths, interests and development in academic and nonacademic areas






DEVELOPING YOUR CHILD

New Media and ICT (New MICT)



- Express thinking logically.



Feedback on Student Learning

- No weighted assessments in Primary 1 and Primary 2.
- Build intrinsic motivation in our students' learning.
- Focus on the holistic development of our students.
- Use of qualitative descriptors to report students' learning progress:
- checklist
- rubrics
- topical reviews
- progress reports by subjects
- characteristics of the students



Feedback on Student Learning

- Report Book Reporting
- ➤ Use subject-specific learning outcomes (LO) and qualitative descriptors to report P1 students' learning progress for ALL subjects at the end of Semesters 1 and 2.
- ➤ **LOs** reflects the syllabus outcomes for P1, and reported at least once in a year (either in Semester 1 or 2, or in both semesters).
- Qualitative descriptors report students' learning progress for each LO.



 - Nurturing positive learning attitudes
 - Encouraging children to learn from their mistakes









RELATE TO OTHERS

Build your child's interpersonal skills by:

- modelling the use of friendly and polite phrases
 - "Hello! My name is...What is your name?"
 - o "May I please..."
- providing opportunities for your child to share and take turns during playtime with other children





DEVELOP GOOD HABITS

Routines help your child build confidence and learn to manage themselves.

Guide your child to do the following independently:

- Practise pre-bedtime routines to have at least 9 hours of sleep
- Dress themselves
- Buy food at the canteen
- Make healthy food choices
- Pack their bag
- Wash their hands
- Take their temperature using a thermometer



NURTURE POSITIVE LEARNING ATTITUDES

Developing the right learning attitude will help your child learn better.

You can encourage your child to:

- ask questions about their experiences and the world around them
- express their thoughts and feelings and discuss what can be done if they have worries
- practise life skills independently like buying food and drinks on their own, and asking for permission



What are some questions you can ask about your child's experience for the day?

You can have conversations with your child to talk about:

- their day
- their feelings
- their goals
- their friends things
 they enjoy together
- what they like about school
- what they want to do
 better

Try these conversation starters with your child

- What did you enjoy doing today?
- What is something new you want to try?
- What are you looking forward to in school tomorrow?
- What did you do today that you are proud of?

- What roles would you like to take on and try in school?
- What is one thing you hope to do better in school this year?





HAVE REGULAR CONVERSATIONS

By doing so, you encourage them to reflect on their experiences by recalling and sharing what they have learnt.

These conversations help you to understand their experiences as you journey with them through their school days and hear their stories.





Good Habits Support for Primary 1

- Check the handbook daily.
- Ensure the children check their timetable and pack their schoolbags
- Check that they have their stationery ready (at least three pencils, one ruler and one eraser in their pencil case)
- Ensure the children have pocket money or food for recess
- Allow your child to share his/her learning experiences with you.
- Guide and monitor their daily assignments (homework).
- Encourage and praise your child for any progress they have made.
