#### **Receiving PSLE Results**

- \*\* Celebrate their efforts through praise and affirmation. Avoid comparisons or labelling what makes a 'good' or 'bad' score.
- \*Assure them that our love and care are not conditional we will support them regardless of the results.
- \*\* Recognise our children for their journey and believe that they can grow through dedication and hard work.
- <u>Emphasise</u> that they are talented in their own ways and not measured by their academic achievements.

### **Exploring Secondary School Option**

- **\*** Choose secondary schools that are suitable for our children's strengths and interests.
- <u>\*A</u>sk our children to research on secondary schools. Empower them to find out what matters to them.
- \*\*Remember to use all 6 secondary school options with a range of cut-off points so that our children are more likely to get their school of choice.
- <u>Engage</u> them in the process.
  Understand their considerations —
  CCAs, school culture, subjects and location. Discuss and decide together.
