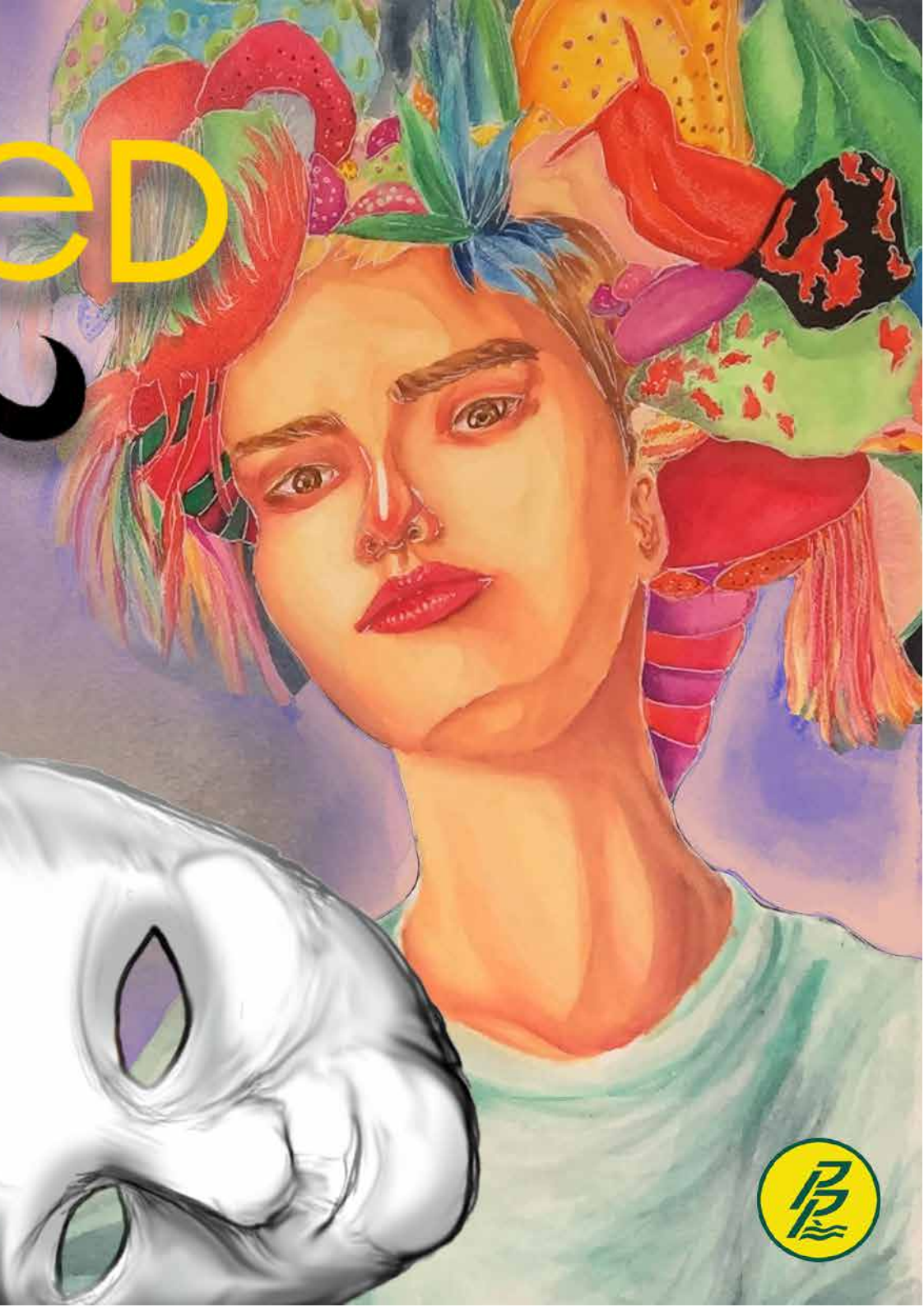

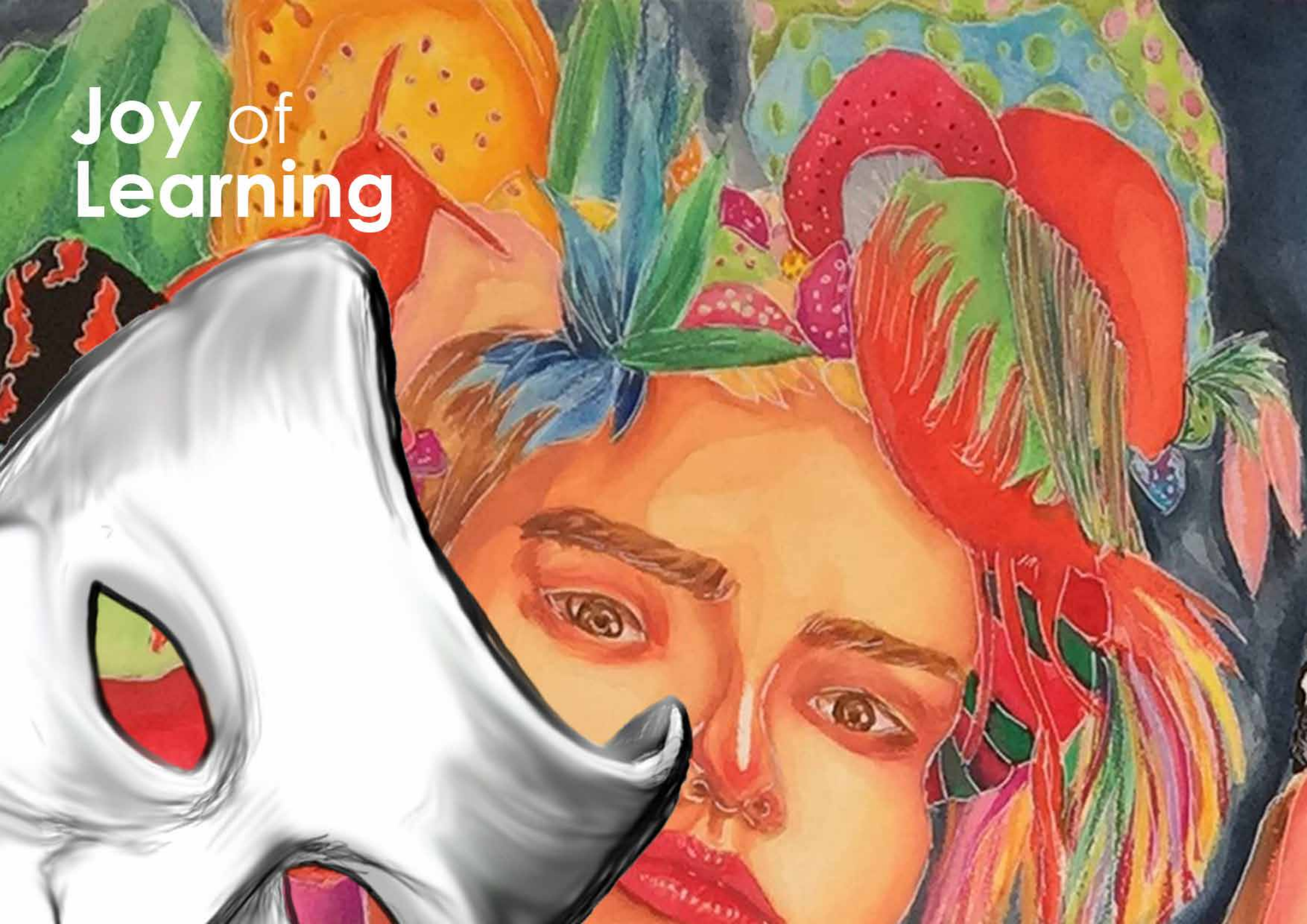

Riding the Next Wave

Officiated by our Guest-of-Honour, Mr Loke Chee Pheng, E6 Cluster Superintendent, our 35th Anniversary Celebrations was a uniquely Pasirian affair where our guests were treated to a tour which featured our school's key programmes and initiatives.



One of the highlights of our 35th Anniversary Celebrations was the launch of our PRSS 21st Century Lifestyle Library which has been revamped to include new programmes, an extensive collection of books, and purposeful zones to support our future-ready learners.

With the implementation of the new English Language Syllabus, our English Language teachers have worked together to design thematic reading activities and book displays, such as Role Models and Friendship, Health and Fitness, and Teen Body and Mind, to complement the extensive reading programme of the new syllabus.



A Makers' Space was also created in the library for students to explore coding and robotics. To further showcase our students' talents, a performance area was created for various drama, poetry or musical recitals.

A Wellness Corner in the library was also set up for students to relax and extend their music learning beyond the classroom. A plug-and-play GO:MIXER Pro, noise-cancelling headphones, specially curated playlists via Spotify Premium and other 'silent' musical instruments have been provided for students to find joy in creating their own musical compositions.

The second highlight of our 35th Anniversary Celebrations was the Art Installation, "Riding the Next Wave", showcased by the Art Unit. Envisioned by our Principal, Mrs Grace Chua, the installation art consists of stylized elements of timber, steel and light, depicting how the school will embark on its next voyage and navigate the complexities of the future with courage and wisdom.



Another highlight of our 35th Anniversary Celebrations is the Urban Farming installation and a tour of our Eco Garden. Our guests harvested some vegetables and learned how PRSS promotes sustainable living through hydroponics. Next, our guests were ushered through the Eco Garden, where they had the opportunity to experience authentic science learning, such as testing the safety of the pond water for consumption and trying their hands at spearfishing.



Staff Learning Festival

The Staff Learning Festival was another key highlight of our 35th Anniversary Celebrations where teachers in the fraternity were invited to three spotlight sessions and 30 concurrent sessions. All the topics were aligned to the MOE key initiatives such as leveraging technology, authentic learning and differentiated instruction. The objective of the learning festival is to promote teacher agency and foster collaborative professionalism among education officers in the fraternity. Two of the three spotlight sessions were helmed by our very own Principal and teachers.



Ms Chew Ting Zhen, a teacher presenter shared, "The introduction of a variety of ICT tools in teaching has enabled me to monitor my students' progress and improve the effectiveness of

teaching and learning in the classroom. The use of videos to teach characterisation has enabled students to work with visual images as scaffolds which enhanced their learning experiences."



Mr Matthew Ng added, "I am thankful for the opportunity to share my work with the teaching community beyond my school. It is also heartening to see teachers of varying experiences embody the spirit of learning and constantly honing their craft."

Teacher Interviews

Conversations with Mr Chua Khoon Wee & Mr Andrew Lim

In this issue, we have the privilege to interview two outstanding teachers who represent the spirit of innovation - seizing opportunities to try new ideas and continuously finding ways to improve them.

Mr Chua Khoon Wee, HOD of Information & Communication Technology, speaks about his work in Personalised Digital Learning Programme (PDLP), and Mr Andrew Lim, HOD of Craft and Technology, speaks about his venture into Urban Farming.

Can you introduce your project of innovation?

Mr Chua Khoon Wee (K): Building on the 1:1 MOE Learning Pilot since 2019, the school has rolled out the Personalised Digital Learning Programme (PDLP) in 2021 and we equipped every Sec 1 to 3 student with a Chromebook, a Personal Learning Device (PLD). This is in line with MOE's "Learn for Life" movement, and the ICT Committee has successfully integrated fortnightly blended learning (BL) days as part of the schooling experience in the new normal. Student-initiated Learning (SIL) was also introduced to enable students to exercise their individual agency in learning, explore their interests and passions, both within and beyond the curriculum.



Mr Andrew Lim (A): There are a couple of reasons why the school wants to embark on Urban Farming as one of the new STEM initiatives for the next wave of innovative changes for PRSS. Firstly, we want to leverage the revised NFS syllabus, starting from 2021, to incorporate urban farming as an authentic learning experience for students to understand the importance of Food Security and Sustainability and the need to be self-reliant to produce essential food supplies such as vegetables, eggs, and fruits. Secondly, it is to provide an opportunity for students to appreciate the hard work by farmers and the challenges they face. Lastly, we hope to equip students with new STEM skills and knowledge so that they grow confident in exploring new career opportunities in high technology farming in the years to come.

What motivates you to do what you do?



K: I enjoy exploring new tools and apps to better engage students and to demonstrate evidence of learning, and also see how these new tools and apps can help teachers provide meaningful and timely feedback. I like the challenge of leveraging technology to empower students in their learning beyond the classroom and to empower them to use technology meaningfully to spread positive messages and advocate for meaningful causes. I get a huge sense of satisfaction seeing students take ownership of their learning and to help them become independent, self-directed and passionate learners. Ultimately, the hope to see students become future-ready through the multi-pronged programme is what drives me in the work I do.

A: When Covid-19 pandemic started in the early part of last year, there were real food security and sustainability issues where many national borders were shut and movement was limited or severely restricted and whether food supplies could continue especially for a nation like Singapore where we are highly dependable on imported food sources. As a result of this experience, there is a national effort launched under the SG2030 Green Plan. As a school, I want to support this SG2030 initiative by providing opportunities for our students to see the possibility to grow our own vegetables in school and maybe outside their HDB flats using basic technology such as water pumps and LED grow lights.

How has your innovation work benefitted the PRSS community?

K: Under this programme, teachers can harness technology for greater effectiveness in teaching and learning, enabled by the use of e-pedagogies to provide active learning experiences for students. The programme also supports self-directed and collaborative learning by enabling students to learn online according to their needs and interests, and to collaborate with each other, anytime and anywhere. Students can also develop digital literacies to thrive in the digital environment.

A: The school purchased one hydroponic unit as the “test bed” for both teachers and students to acquire the skills to grow different varieties of vegetables from Nov 2020. To date, we have harvested 4 rounds of produce: Georgina Lettuces (1st round), Nai Bai (2nd and 3rd rounds) and Amaranth Spinach (4th round). These vegetables were used by our NFS students to prepare healthy dishes and given as gifts for our students and VIPs during our 35th Anniversary Celebrations.

What are your plans for the future of PRSS in terms of innovation?

K: While COVID-19 has disrupted our daily lives and led to much inconvenience, it has also led to the acceleration of ICT adoption and evolution of how students learn. Riding on the momentum of the PDLP and digital revolution, we plan to redesign the learning spaces in school and break the boundaries that define a typical classroom. For example, the 'Classroom of the Future' is where students can seamlessly harness virtual or augmented reality for learning, conduct synchronous interactions with experts and counterparts from across the globe and enhance their personalised learning through adaptive technologies.

A: As the current "purchased" hydroponic unit is primarily meant for the experimentation with growing different varieties of vegetables, the growing capacity is rather restrictive. Hence, as a step forward, there is a need to design and fabricate our own in-house hydroponic unit with larger growing capacity so that a class of 40 students can be involved in the growing process. After studying the "purchased" unit, the D&T team came together to identify the possible improvements and changes required and the proposed in-house hydroponic unit (in 3D) was conceptualised. The D&T teachers together with the students can then learn to fabricate more units that can be used by students to cut softer materials such as cardboards, thin plywoods and acrylic sheets to create useful parts for IPW or school improvement projects as part of SIL. We also hope to explore the use of IoTs (internet of things) to design and create useful smart devices or gadgets as part of SIL.



Surviving the O-Levels

The term 'O-Levels', when mentioned in Singapore, can fill a young person with fear and anxiety — the expectation to succeed, coupled with fear of rejection and failure cause many students to be stressed and anxious. It may seem challenging in terms of finding a way to obtain a high grade. When the O-Level results were released on 11 January of 2021, we managed to interview five of our top scorers. According to our then top scorers, the key ingredients to success is time management and discipline.



"I learnt to manage my time and be disciplined as I need to balance both my school work and meeting up the demands as the Captain of the Volleyball team," Jadalyn Ang from 4E6 2020 stated. "It was really hard to do at first, as I took 8 subjects that were very challenging. With

good time management and self-discipline, I made the effort to study everyday, even if it was for a short while. It was not easy but I pushed myself to do my best. "

Poh Zen Hao of 4E5 2020 also agreed, "Discipline and time management played a huge part in my ability to score well. I am very passionate about my CCA, Chinese orchestra. I strived to do the best I could. I channelled that passion into

my studies, making sure I studied systematically and consistently. Consistency is the key to getting the grades I desired. I am also never shy to ask the teachers whenever I needed to clarify my understanding of the topics taught."



A year of constant studying and revision is not an easy feat, with lessons disrupted. Many students may inevitably lose their stamina along the way. However, it does not only stop there. With good time management and discipline, all five students have proven that with this "formula", it is possible to achieve success.

Another important factor that played a part in their success is encouragement and help from both their seniors and teachers.

"I was honestly not putting in enough effort when I was in lower secondary. But one day I heard about a senior who scored 8 distinctions and was really inspired to do as well as she did. Because of that, I strove to be like her and do well for the O-Levels too," Zen Hao shared enthusiastically..

"I would say that hearing the stories from my seniors about their O-Level journey really woke me up. They shared about the late-night studying, the struggles, the increasing stress and meeting one's expectations," Leong Jia Xin of 4E5 2020 elaborated.



"It suddenly dawned on me that sitting for the O-

Levels is a rite of passage for all students. I realised I had to study really hard instead of just going with the flow."

"You must also seek help when needed!", Lim Zhi Sun of 4E6 2020 equipped, "I was super

annoying in class. I kept pestering my teachers, asking them even the simplest of questions. But it really bore fruit later, and I was able to fully understand what I was learning. You have to take more initiative and you can't be shy! And honestly I gained a lot of confidence after repeatedly asking questions."

"Yes, don't ever regret seeking help. There is no shame in asking for help," Zen Hao added. "I also asked my teachers a lot of questions to the annoyance of my classmates. It really helped me in the end."

To no one's surprise, hard work is incredibly crucial to scoring well in the O-Levels. Scoring well for the O-Levels is not a walk in the park. It is an arduous journey with lots of hurdles along the way.

Right now, for most students, the O-Level is on top priority. But it's worth realising that our society, while evolving and becoming more globalised, is only getting more complex. Our futures seem so bright and yet so unpredictable. It's better to realise sooner than later that

studies and grades do not count for everything, but it is still important for us to do the best we can "Results are important but it is not everything," Jia Xin acknowledged. "When you graduate from secondary school, you don't want to remember your days filled with just studying. Remember to take breaks and hang out with your friends, go out, eat and have some fun too. Make your last year a memorable and meaningful one!"
