On Monday, Mum makes Becky Bunny's favourite carrot cake.






On Tuesday, Little Brother shares his toys to cheer Becky Bunny up.

It's kick-off time! Becky Bunny is eager to score a goal.


The Bunny family cheers excitedly.

to support Becky Bunny and her team.



Becky Bunny thinks and says, "Yes, we gave it our all today. Even though we did not win, I am glad we stayed on and played together as a team."




The Bunny family gathers around Becky Bunny.

"We are proud of you for playing well with your team," commends Mum.


