



Sungei SECONDHANDS

The **SUNGEI SECONDHANDS** initiative by Central Singapore CDC was started to help Sungei Road hawkers in need of assistance to relocate to stalls in hawker centres. The programme helps these hawkers to set-up and "renov-aid" their stall, as well as find second-hand goods to sell.

The first Sungei Secondhands stall was supported by the Peace Connect Senior Activity Centre, the Golden Mile Hawkers' Association, Kampong Glam Citizens' Consultative Committee, National Environment Agency and the Jalan Besar Social Service Office

Cardboard Collectors ASSIST

The **CARDBOARD COLLECTORS ASSIST** is an initiative by Central Singapore CDC to help cardboard collectors in the Central Singapore District.


Piloted early this year, the programme works with Social Service Offices, Voluntary Welfare Organisations, as well as the local community to befriend and help these seniors get community support.

Free meals are distributed to the seniors once a month, and quarterly gatherings are organised to enable them to get to know one another.

Student volunteer groups from Nanyang Polytechnic (NYP) outreached to the Cardboard Collectors regularly. Students from NYP and the Institute of Technical Education (ITE) also organised a gathering with free hair cuts and massages for these seniors.

WHAT MAKES A GIRAFFE AND GIRAFFE HERO?

GIRAFFES are characterised by these criteria:

- 1. **Significance:** They are proactive in addressing a community need and/or cause.
- 2. **Sustainability:** They make regular (monthly) and sustained contributions between one to five years.
- **3. Sacrifice:** They do not act only for personal gain or as part of their school/employment duties.

GIRAFFE HEROES are characterised by these additional criteria:

- 1. Significance: They lead an initiative in order to address a community need and/or cause.
- **2. Sustainability:** They make regular and sustained contributions over at least five years.
- **3. Sacrifice:** They sacrifice their personal resources and/or needs, and put others above themselves.



STICK YOUR NECK OUT!

UOB Plaza at Raffles Place played host to Singapore's first-ever Giraffes Party on 8 August 2017. Organised to spread awareness on the **Giraffes Singapore** movement, the event also saw the launch of the Giraffe Heroes Recognition Scheme to encourage more Singaporeans to do good for the community.

s part of a week-long campaign to spread awareness on the GIRAFFES SINGAPORE movement, Raffles Place Park was transformed into a playful giraffe wonderland from 1 to 8 August.

An initiative by Central Singapore CDC, Giraffes Singapore aims to recognise and build a community of individuals who stick their necks out for the common good in a significant, sustainable and sacrificial way.

GIRAFFES SINGAPORE

Two types of Giraffes are recognised under the initiative: GIRAFFES — individuals who proactively address a community need or cause over a period of one to five years, and GIRAFFE HEROES — individuals who go a step further to lead community initiatives and make sustained contributions over five years or more.

GIRAFFES PARTY

The campaign culminated in the first-ever Giraffes Party at UOB Plaza on 8 August.





Not many know that the keys to Adrian Tan's relentless creativity are Attention-Deficit/Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD) and Obsessive Compulsive Disorder (OCD). This is what he had to say about The Advantage of Being Disadvantaged.

drian Tan is not your ordinary arty guy. With 400 creative awards under his belt, the founder of local advertising agency, Ad Planet, gave the audience something to think about.

Beginning with the mantra of his agency, "Belief Creates Possibilities", he highlighted the importance of not labelling others in a negative way. "I think that we should believe in everybody. Their supposed disabilities can be changed into powerful advantages and possibilities."

OBSESSIVE-COMPULSIVE DEDICATION

Citing his own "disabilities", Adrian shared how he turned conditions like Obsessive Compulsive Disorder (OCD) into positive traits.

"To me, OCD doesn't mean Obsessive Compulsive Disorder. I think it's Obsessive Compulsive Dedication. It's about wanting perfection

DARING TO DREAM

Both Adrian and his wife **Shook Wah** have gone on to start the Dare to Dream Scholarship, helping special needs students with financial limitations to pursue their dreams and talents.

Shook Wah summed it up nicely, saying, "I think we recognise that many of us, myself included, have pre-conceived notions about the disadvantaged and special needs people. But we really hope to change these perceptions and have a world where we can look beyond their disabilities to recognise their abilities."

ON LIFE AND DEATH

Not one to rest on his laurels, Mr Liak observed that many today often don't live life well and only regret it when their time is up.

"Many people are afraid to die. But there is a small group of people who live their life well, have family support, friendship, and enough resources to take care of themselves. And ironically, many of these people are looking forward to death."

urious by nature, Ms Low Khah Gek is always open to trying new things and learning. The Chief Executive Officer of the Institute of Technical Education (ITE) believes that taking on new types of work helps one learn and improve.

"Taking on new responsibilities invariably compels and inspires me to learn. I also get great satisfaction from engaging in conversations and working alongside people from different job levels and walks of life," says Ms Low.

Her enthusiasm for learning has helped her steer ITE in the right direction — to create opportunities for students and adult learners to acquire skills, knowledge and values for employability and lifelong-learning.

A MINDSET TO LEARN FOR LIFE

Citing the importance of transforming industries and harnessing the capabilities of new technologies to improve the skillsets of our workers, Ms Low says that's where the importance of SkillsFuture comes into play.

"SkillsFuture ensures Singaporeans will have good employability and the skills to create the future — the individual's future and, collectively, Singapore's future. Individuals need to have relevant skills, be good at applying these skills, and have the lifelong-learning mindset to keep learning to develop deeper skills."

EMPLOYABILITY IN A CHANGING WORLD

Serving both students and working adults, ITE adopts a practice-based, industry-relevant approach to training. To help existing employees in the workplace upskill themselves, the institute has also conducted 'Train-the-Trainer' courses for more than 2,000 companies to provide their employees with relevant on-the-job training.

"Students and adult learners have found our training facilities, equipment and pedagogy to be engaging and readily applicable at the workplace," shares Ms Low.

"With the challenges and fast-changing landscape at work and in life, you will get lost without resilience. One must see the big picture and be committed to a longer-term goal. That is why we don't just learn for one career. Learning must be life-long."

She adds that people are realising that skills are necessary in today's digitalised and technology-driven world. "We have seen a shift in mindset towards skills courses conducted by ITE," Ms Low says. "40 per cent of our CET participants today are ITE graduates who wish to refresh or upgrade their skills, and 10 per cent are diploma and degree holders who wish to learn a new skill."

Believing that continual learning is key for a more secure future, Ms Low and her team will continue to emphasise that at ITE. "When the motivation to deliver quality work or when quality impact is high, the desire to seek out various means and platforms to learn will follow," she says.





"Good things take time. I think it is always easy to cut corners to get things done, but at the end of the day, if we want quality work, we have to put in the time and effort."





#3. CHENG'S @ 27

Third-generation family food and beverage businesses are few and far between, but family members from Hainanese eatery **CHENG'S @ 27** are giving their all to make it work.

Cheng's Delicacies was started in the early 1980s at Pekin Street by Cheng Mook Boon and his wife Lim Toi Ang. The business moved to their current address at Yong Siak Street, and when the shop lease ended in 2013, the third generation decided to continue it.

"We thought it was a huge pity that our existing customers and many more potential ones would no longer have the chance to taste family home-cooked food which can touch one's heart and soul," says Glenn Cheng, 34, the grandson of Mr Cheng.

After taking over, Glenn and his family gave the place a major overhaul in mid-2014 and renamed it Cheng's @ 27, making the brand more catchy, easier to pronounce and to remember (27 is the eatery's unit number).

Putting his knowledge of technology to good use, Glenn also launched a website where the public can purchase Cheng's cakes, kaya and *kueh*.

#4. NAIISE

With only S\$3,000 and zero design experience, Dennis Tay, 32, founded NAIISE, a curated online destination for original, well-designed products in 2013.

Pioneering the omni-channel strategy in Singapore, Naiise offers customers the flexibility to buy online and collect offline, and vice versa. The pop-up stalls are also a key driver of their business.

"By allowing our customers to walk into our physical spaces, to touch and feel the products and hear the brand stories behind them, they are able to understand better why they are paying a bit more for a well-made product. Hence, the pop-ups were great ways for us to continuously give value, not just to our brands, but to our customers as well," says Dennis.

Not wanting to "waste" local design talent, at least 800 of the 1,300 brands that Naiise carries are made by local designers. The brand has expanded to Malaysia and will be opening its first UK-based store at the end of the year.

"I'm a firm believer that life is unpredictable," shares Dennis. "I believe in living each and every day to the fullest and to accomplish what I can for the people within and outside our business."

PANIC DISORDER

The Singapore Mental Health survey found that 100,000 Singaporeans aged 18 and above will suffer from at least one anxiety disorder in their lifetime. This includes panic attacks that stem from panic disorder. Here are some signs and symptoms you should be aware of.

Signs

Common symptoms

include sudden attacks of intense fear, during which the individual may experience sweatiness, shortness of breath, weakness, nausea, or dizziness.



2 hours

The length of time that panic attacks can return in waves, in unusual instances. Typically, these attacks should not last for more than a few minutes at a time.

20%

The percentage of adults who will experience at least one panic attack in their lifetime, with most remembering their first experience vividly.



Women

are more likely to suffer from panic disorder than men. The disorder has a prevalence rate of 3-5% in the normal population on the whole.



people actually receive help for their panic disorder, with most people having to visit up to 10 doctors before being diagnosed correctly.
